1. Roll call and declaration of quorum

The chairman welcomed all attendees and called the regular meeting to order at 2:10 pm on February 24, 2010 at the Presidents Conference Room.

Seven (7) members were present and (15) Fifteen members were absent.

There is more than 25% present so the meeting proceeded to discuss the agenda items.

2. <u>Discussions re: Trade Desk Financial Corp. (TDFC)</u>

Gordon and Jimmy who were tasked to research about TDFC informed the Committee that they could not find a direct link between TDFC and Bank of America or Meryll Lynch. They advised that it's hard to find adequate information about TDFC from the web. They also found out about an SEC citation in 1990 for David W. Schames. However there was no indication if this is the same person.

It was also noted that the New York address for TDFC is just a forwarding address for the

North Carolina office, and that the agreement provided by TDFC has no signature from Meryll Lynch.

The committee agreed that the available information is not sufficient to establish 100% confidence in dealing with TDFC. Accordingly, Eddie moved and Gordon seconded the motion to defer further action in arranging investments through TDFC, which will be transmitted to members for electronic voting.

The committee will continue to work in gathering more information regarding TDFC particularly in the establishment of its credibility as the duly authorized representative of Meryll Lynch. The following are the suggested actions that will be considered by the committee gather more information about TDFC:

- Contact Meryll Lynch
- Check with the college's existing investment consultant and money managers
- Communicate with the provided references

3. Statements of Revenues and Expenditures

The Chairman proceeded in discussing the Revenues and Expenditures report for the first quarter of fiscal year 2010, and the details of revenue for fall 2009 and spring 2010.

Jimmy informed the committee that the composition of the enrollment has been changing dramatically wherein certificate students are increasing and degree students are decreasing. Likewise, fall headcount has been decreasing for the last four fall semesters.
